## b) Has institution established a Gravience Redressal Mechanism:

Yes

For redressing the major grievances of students, 'Grievance Redressal Cell' has been formed in the college with one male and one female teacher in charge. The major grievances of students are heard by this cell and after mutual discussions and consent, the final solution is forwarded to the head of the college for approval.
